How to download the ICD-10 MIT 2014 file in CSV format from the NDoH's website

A CSV file can be integrated into many different programs except for MSExcel.

ICD-10 MIT 2014 CSV

- Save the file to your computer.
- You can open the CSV file in Notepad. (Open the file with **Notepad** and you will see the complete MIT comma delimited)
- Please note that if a comma appears in the text, it is read as text since it falls within the "quote marks" of that specific group. We indicated that the .csv file will have pipe delimiters, but the file with a .csv extension is keeping the commas in the text of the descriptions in the correct format.
- Not recommended to open a CSV file in Excel - remember that if you open the file with the .csv extension, with Excel all the R codes will become rand values – which are incorrect for the file purpose.
